Message from the President

On August 12, 2016, a Government Blockchain group had their first meetup in the luxurious Tower Club in Tysons Corner, Virginia. Two guests showed up. One left early and the other (Mark Waser) stayed and continued to attend meetings. An interest in blockchain was taking off in New York, Silicon Valley and in Europe. However, almost no one in the halls of governments even knew what it was. They did know about bitcoin, but it was believed to only be a tool for drug dealers and terrorists. Anyone looking to build blockchain-based solutions in the government felt like an outcast in the middle of the desert. In August of 2016, the total global market cap for blockchain-based cryptocurrencies was about \$11 billion (US).

One and a half years later, the market cap has exploded by over 4,400% to \$486 billion (US). The Government Blockchain Association (GBA) has almost 40 chapters around the world with more than 3,000 people attending events. In the past two months, the Government Blockchain Association has opened new chapters in the US, Canada, England, Ireland, France, Russia, Dubai, Singapore, and the UAE. Many more are starting in Africa, along with Central and South America. Blockchain is now on the agenda of leaders in the executive, legislative and judicial branches of governments world-wide. GBA members have hosted events for congressional representatives and met with administrative officials around the world. The momentum behind the use of this technology for government solutions is staggering.

What we need now are platforms where people in this space can communicate, collaborate, develop their capabilities and work together to find solutions. To meet that need, the GBA has made a commitment to establish chapters in every major city in the world. Participation is free, and you can find out about the chapter nearest you on our website (<https://governmentblockchain.org/blockchain-resources/working-groups-location-chapters>). If there is not currently a chapter near you, let us know and we can work with you to start one.

The GBA has also established working groups on subjects like supply chain management, legal, legislative, regulatory, energy, and many, many more. GBA Leadership Call

GBA had our first Leadership call on December 8, 2017. Chapter Leaders and Working Group leaders from around the world participated in the three calls that occurred at 9:00 AM, 3:00 PM and Midnight. During the call, the GBA Core Team ([Gerard Dache](#), [Jonathan Lehman](#), [Rob Perry](#), & [James Kana](#)) briefed the leadership team on the history, current status and plans of the GBA. The Core Team also solicited feedback and questions. 40 questions were recorded during the three calls and the responses have been consolidated, answered, and are being distributed back to all of the chapter and working group leaders. GBA plans to hold these calls regularly in the future.

The GBA is launching a suite of classes that make up the GBA Consulting Series. The courses include:

Government Blockchain Leadership Summit (May 2018 - Washington, DC)

The GBA is in discussions with the [Insight Exchange Network](#) to co-host a Government Blockchain Leadership conference the first week in May of 2018. The current concept is that the event would facilitate the GBA's annual leadership strategic planning session as well as being an opportunity for others to come and learn and network on topics related to government blockchain. Breakout sessions would be organized around GBA Working Group topics like Asset Management, Energy, Compliance/Law Enforcement, Cybersecurity, Supply Chain Management, and Voting. We are trying to get additional rooms so that the local leadership team (Chapter Leads and Working Group Leads) could meet to review and discuss our bylaws, methods, procedures, and plans. We are also planning to conduct "GBA Instructor" courses to license individuals to deliver GBA courses world-wide. Attending this course would be required to become a GBA licensed instructor. The proposed structure of the program will likely be:

May 1 (Day): Presentations / Working Sessions



May 2 (Day): Presentations / Working Sessions

May 3 (Day): Washington Sightseeing/networking event (Families invited)

These are proposals at this point. We still need to confirm venue and other details. We will distribute this information as soon as it is finalised. 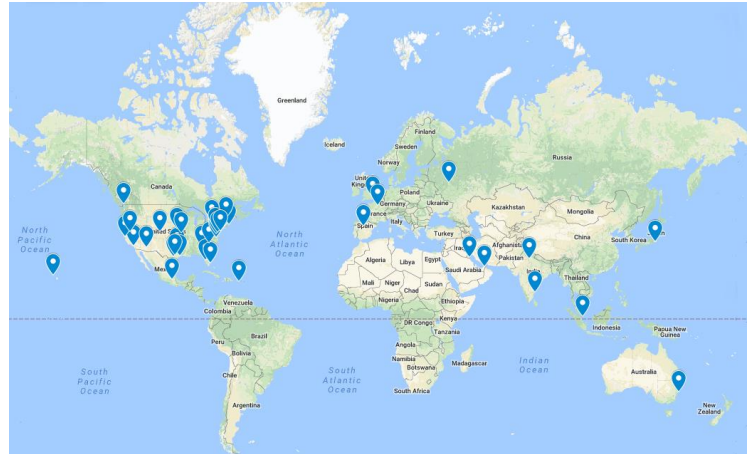

New: Student Chapters

Starting in 2018, the GBA will be launching student chapters on college and university campuses around the world. Student chapters are led by students with a faculty moderator who is a GBA Professional Member. GBA training materials and instructors will be available to the student chapters. GBA Member companies will sponsor hackathons to look for innovative solutions to government problems. We are currently working with government leaders to identify challenges for the students. Winners will have opportunities to demonstrate their solutions to industry and government executives. We will also host job fairs for student chapters to help member companies hire qualified blockchain resources. GBA is currently looking to identify volunteers to help manage this program. Chapters Highlights

- **Toronto, ON (Canada)** - The Toronto chapter of the GBA took a booth at a Blockchain event in downtown Toronto. The event was attended by 700 participants interested in crypto and blockchain technologies. 100's of people were introduced to the GBA in a face to face meeting and the overwhelming response was that the GBA is serving a much-needed function in the burgeoning blockchain space.
- **Paris (France)** – The French regulator, AMF (Autorité des Marchés Financiers) has issued a discussion paper on ICOs and has asked for contributions. Leila Nassiri (Paris Chapter), is coordinating with Michael Bombace (Financial Regulatory & Compliance), Bernie Doyle (Financial Oversight), and Suzannah Simmons (Legislative & Legal) to prepare a comprehensive response to this request on behalf of the GBA. We are extremely excited about this effort as it is a prime example of how we can leverage the



Working Groups to respond to Government needs. Our responses will be published through the site and highlighted in the next newsletter.

- **Mexico City (Mexico)** - First event hosted 80 guests at the at Tecnológico de Monterrey University. Additional events planned with other universities in February and April. The GBA Mexico has been invited to speak at a Mexican Internet Association event in March.
- **Atlanta, GA (USA)** - Despite the once in a five-year snow-storm in Atlanta, the GBA Blockchain Foundations workshop, part 1 of 5 in a [GBA certification](#) course, went forward. Participants flew in from Poland, China, Chicago, and New York, while others drove through six inches of snow overnight from DC and North Carolina. It was a great day with mostly developers and some miners looking to fill gaps in their blockchain knowledge. Participants are eager and waiting for the remaining 4 workshops to complete their official GBA certification. In addition, discussions were held with the President of GBA - Global, Gerard Dache, to open a GBA training center in Atlanta, coming in Q1 2018.
- **Denver, CO (USA)** - Had a successful Intro to Blockchain GBA class. Met with representatives at the State of Colorado around making Colorado a Blockchain innovation state. Would like to explore a Smart Contract working group.
- **Puerto Rico (USA)** - Hosting first meeting on January 25th. Visit [Meetup Site](#) for more details.

New Project: Blockchain System – Security Authorization

Blockchain technology is rapidly gaining traction in the government spaces. Several federal agencies such as GSA, CDC, and FDA have started exploring the technology and even have pilot programs. However, for a Blockchain system to be used in a production environment and handle real data and customers it must meet stringent federal security requirements. A system must go through a complete Security Authorization (SA) before it is granted an Authorization to



Operate (ATO) and blockchain systems are no exception. This project involves studying how to get blockchain solutions through the ATO process. For more information contact [Ajay Chandhok](#).

Financial Regulatory and Compliance Working Group

A New Working Group has been formed to create think tanks with private and public sector members and to help educate regulatory lawmakers on the technical, financial, and fundamental state of cryptoassets. This group is a collective group of leaders, and business owners in the cryptoasset financial markets. Their goal is to help government authorities like the US SEC, CFTC, and IRS regulate with a comprehensive and thorough understanding the fundamentals and nature of blockchain based assets.
